MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1941

PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF CERTAIN WORDS AND EMBLEMS FOR 2013 AFRICAN CUP OF NATIONS (AFCON) SOUTH AFRICA

WHEREAS in terms of Section 15 (1)(b) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1941 (Act No.17 of 1941, the Minister may, after such investigation as he or she may think fit, by notice in the Gazette, prohibit either absolutely or conditionally the use of any mark, word, letter or figure or any arrangement or combination thereof, in connection with any trade, business, profession, occupation or event, or in connection with a trade mark, mark or trade description applied to goods.

I, Dr Rob Davies, the Minister of Trade and Industry hereby prohibit certain words, letters, emblems, devices and numerals, as depicted in the attached Annexure, in connection with the 2013 African Cup of Nations (AFCON) South Africa.

The prohibition only applies to activities connected to the 2013 African Cup of Nations (AFCON) South Africa in the area of Football or Soccer 2013 CAF African Cup of Nations.

The prohibition also does not apply to the media, provided that the reportage is fair and not imbued with unscrupulous business enterprise.

This Notice is conditional and effective from the date of publication in the Government Gazette and shall terminate one (1) month after the last game of the tournament, the 2013 African Cup of Nations (AFCON) South Africa.
