NATIONAL BARGAINING COUNCIL OF THE LEATHER INDUSTRY OF SOUTH AFRICA: EXTENSION TO NON-PARTIES OF THE TANNING SECTION COLLECTIVE AMENDING AGREEMENT

(hereafter referred to as the "employers" or the "employers' organisation") and the



being parties to the National Bargaining Council of the Leather Industry of South Africa, to extend and amend the Agreement published under Government Notices No R.1318 of 6 November 1998 as further amended, renewed and re-enacted under Government Notices Nos. R287 of 12 March 1999, R.1017 of 27 August 1999, R.47 of 28 January 2000, R.555 of 9 June 2000, R.128 of 9 February 2001, R.389 of 18 May 2001, R823 of 7 September 2001, R.1230 of 30 November 2001, R.693 of 17 May 2002, R.1531 of 13 December 2002, R.714 of 6 June 2003, R.1357 of 3 October

1. SCOPE OF APPLICATION OF AGREEMENT

- (1) The terms of this agreement will be observed in the tanning section of the leather industry -
 - (a) in the Republic of South Africa,
 - (b) by all employers who are members of the employers' organisation, and by all employees who are members of the trade unions, and who are engaged or employed in the said section of the industry.
- (2) The terms of this Agreement will apply only to employees for whom wages are prescribed in terms of this agreement, and to employers of such employees.
- (3) The terms of this agreement will not apply to non parties in respect of clauses 1 (1)(b) and 2 (1).

2. DATE AND PERIOD OF OPERATION

- This Agreement will come into operation for the parties on 1 July 2020
 and remain in force for the period ending 30 June 2021.
- This Agreement will come into operation for non-parties on such date as the Minister of Employment and Labour extends the agreement to them, and will remain in force for the period ending 30 June 2021.



3. CLAUSE 9 TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

Subclause 9.2: Severance Pay

Insert new subclause 9.2(2)

The severance pay for employees dismissed for reasons of the employer's operational requirements shall be calculated on the wage rates as prescribed in Schedule 3.


CLAUSE 7 REMUNERATION

5.2 Clause 7.1 Wages and Wage Rates

Substitute the following for subclause (1):

- (a) An employer will pay an employee at least the wages prescribed in terms of Schedule 1 until the period ending 31 December 2020.
- (a) With effect from 1 January 2021, an employer will pay an employee at least the wages prescribed in terms of Schedule 3
