
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Many countries around the globe have continued with a positive growth trajectory following a promising post covid-19 economic recovery. However, growth has been slower in 2022. A comparison on a quarterly basis indicates that growth rates in the fourth quarter were lower than the levels recorded in the third quarter of 2022 for all the selected economies (see Table 1).

In comparison, growth was relatively stronger in emerging economies, in the third quarter of 2022 except in Russia where the economy contracted in the second and third quarters of 2022.


Graph 1. Advanced Countries: GDP Growth


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Inflation was relatively lower in December 2022 compared to the preceding two months in most advanced economies (see Table 2). In contrast, inflation slightly increased in Japan, although it remained significantly lower than the level in the rest of the advanced economies. Inflation continued to decline for most advanced economies in 2023.

Emerging Economies generally exhibited lower inflation, with the lowest being in China. However, inflation in Russia was relatively higher reaching double digits between October 2022 and January 2023.


Graph 3. Advanced Countries: Inflation





Unemployment rates were relatively lower in the last three months of 2022 compared to same period of 2021, for most advanced economies, except Germany where a slight rise was recorded (see Table 3). Among the advanced economies, Japan and the US recorded the lowest unemployment rates while, the highest was registered in Italy followed by France.

In the emerging economies, a comparison of the last three months of 2022 to the corresponding period in 2021 reveals that unemployment relatively increased in India and China, while it declined in Russia and Brazil. Brazil and India recorded higher unemployment rates compared to the rest of emerging economies and advanced economies. Russia recorded the lowest unemployment rate compared to all the selected emerging and advanced economies excluding Japan and the US.



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
Advanced economies continued registering monthly increases in exports in the last quarter of 2022, compared to the beginning of the year (see Table 4). A similar trend was observed in Brazil, among the emerging economies.

China's exports were lower in December 2022 compared to January 2022, although an increment was recorded in December 2022 compared to the preceding month.



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
Monthly imports in advanced economies, generally peaked in December 2022, compared to their level at the beginning of the year (See Table 5).



Stock market indices in most of the selected markets of advanced economies had declined in January 2023, compared to their January 2022 levels (see Table 6). Contrary, stock market indices in the United Kingdom, France and the Eurozone generally rose during the same period.

Among the emerging economies, stock market indices improved in India and Brazil in 2023, compared to their levels a year earlier. In Contrast, Russia and China saw declines in stock market indices during the same period.

Graph 12. Stock Market Indexes



Movements against the United States Dollar (USD)

As of January 2023, the USD dollar appreciated against most major global currencies, except the Russian Ruble and Brazil Real, compared to the same period of the previous year (see Table 7). The highest appreciation was recorded against the Japanese Yen at 13.2 percent in January 2023.

On a monthly basis, however, all selected major currencies appreciated against the USD with the highest being recorded for the Russian Ruble at 3.8 percent followed by Brazilian Real at 3.7 percent.

Movements against the Unit of Account of the African Development Bank (UA)

A review of selected 18 global currencies indicated that 10 recorded monthly depreciations against the Unit of Account (UA) of the African Development¹, while 8 recorded appreciations in January 2023, compared to the previous month (see Table 8).

On annual basis, 9 currencies appreciated against the UA while the rest depreciated with the highest rate at 72 percent for Argentina's Peso followed by 36 percent for Turkish lira.

¹:The AfDB uses UA as the reporting currency and is equivalent to the IMF's Special Drawing Right (SDR). The SDR is a basket of currencies.



All African countries recorded economic growth, of varying magnitudes in 2022 on a quarterly basis, except for some incidents of economic contraction in Equatorial Guinea and Burkina Faso during the first and second quarters respectively (see Table 9).


Cabo Verde, Mauritius, Rwanda and Seychelles were among the countries with the highest quarterly economic growth during 2022. These countries, except Rwanda, were recovering from significant economic contractions observed in the beginning of 2021. Rwanda sustained growth throughout 2021.

In the third quarter of 2022, African countries recorded economic growth ranging between 17.1 percent in Cabo Verde and 0.4 percent in Burkina Faso.


Graph 13. Central Africa: GDP Growth
(quarterly data, % annual change)




Graph 14. East Africa: GDP Growth


Graph 15. North Africa: GDP Growth



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
In December 2022, all African countries recorded inflation rates of varying degrees, except South Sudan where a deflation of 11.6 percent was recorded (see Table 10). Inflation ranged between 243.8 percent in Zimbabwe and 2.5 percent in Seychelles.

Most African countries witnessed a monthly decline in inflation between December and November 2022. However, a rise in inflation was recorded in some few countries during the same period, namely Ghana by 3.8 percentage points, Democratic Republic of Congo (1.2 percentage points) and Algeria (1.1 percentage points).


Graph 18. Central Africa: Inflation
(monthly data, % annual change)




Graph 19. East Africa: Inflation
(monthly data, % annual change)




Graph 20. North Africa: Inflation


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In the first half of 2022, most African countries witnessed a continued growth in exports which extended the post covid-19 pandemic recovery trends observed in 2021 (see Table 11). In the second quarter of 2022, notable improvement in exports was recorded in many countries such as Algeria which more than doubled the earnings compared to the same period of 2021.


However, five countries namely Niger, Uganda, Mali, Zimbabwe and South Africa saw declines in export earnings during the same period.

Analysis of quarterly exports indicates a lower trade during the third quarter of 2022, for a few countries with available data.


Graph 23. Central Africa: Exports
(quarterly data, USD million)




Graph 24. East Africa: Exports
(quarterly data, USD million)




Graph 25. North Africa: Exports




Imports grew on annual basis between the second quarter of 2022 and second quarter of 2021 for most African countries (see Table 12). Few countries that recorded a decline in imports were Mali, Malawi, Uganda, Sudan and Botswana.

Similar trends were observed on comparison of the first and second quarter of 2022. Imports generally increased in most countries, indicating the continued post covid-19 recovery trend in international trade.


Graph 28. Central Africa: Imports
(quarterly data, USD million)




Graph 29. East Africa: Imports
(quarterly data, USD million)




Graph 30. North Africa: Imports

Data from selected African countries indicates that monthly crude oil production doubled in December 2022 compared to the same period of 2021, for most economies (see Table 13). Crude oil production increased significantly in Libya by 106 percent, followed by Algeria (104.5 percent), the Republic of Congo and Gabon (100 percent) Angola (94.6 percent) and Equatorial Guinea (63.5 percent).

On a monthly basis, however, crude oil production was lower in December 2022 compared to the preceding month except in Nigeria and Libya where it increased.





Data from selected African countries indicates that tourism arrivals have significantly improved in 2022 compared to levels recorded in the preceding 2 years (see Table 14). In December 2022 monthly tourist arrivals were higher by 180 percent in South Africa, 170 Percent in Mauritius, 42 percent in the Gambia and 18 percent in Seychelles, compared to the same period of the preceding year.


Graph 33. Crude Oil Production (monthly data, Thousand barrels per day)




Graph 34. Crude Oil Production (monthly data, Thousand barrels per day)






Graph 37. Foreign Exchange Reserves



Broad money supply (M2) grew during the fourth quarter of 2022, compared to the corresponding months of 2021, except for Angola (see Table 17). The highest broad money growth, during the period, was recorded in South Africa followed by Malawi, Egypt, Nigeria and Burundi.


Graph 40. Money Supply M1

(% change on same month of previous year YoY)




Graph 41. Money Supply M1




Graph 43. Money Supply M2

(% change on same month of previous year YoY)




Graph 44. Money Supply M2




Stock Market indicators, from selected African markets, indicated mixed trend in January 2023 (see Table 18). Stock market indices in Egypt, Tunisia, Nigeria and South Africa increased by respective rates of 43.4 percent, 16.7 percent, 14.2 percent and 7.0 percent in January 2023 compared to the same period of last year.

In contrast, stock market indices declined in Morocco, Ghana, Kenya, Mauritius and Côte d'Ivoire, during the same period.


Graph 46. Stock Market Index




Graph 48. Stock Market Index

In January 2023, out of 36 African currencies reviewed, 29 currencies depreciated against the USD on annual basis, while 7 currencies recorded appreciations (see Table 19). The highest currency depreciation against USD was recorded for the Zimbabwean Dollar at 57.5 percent. Of the seven currencies that recorded appreciations against the USD, the highest appreciation at 5.0 percent was recorded for the Guinea Franc.

On a monthly basis, between January 2023 and December 2022, 19 currencies depreciated against the USD, one remained unchanged, while the rest appreciated. The highest monthly depreciation against the USD was recorded for the Egyptian pound at 22 percent, while the highest appreciation against USD was for Madagascar's Ariary at 4.4 percent.
